Major General Thomas D. Robinson was assigned as the Deputy Commanding General, United States Army Reserve, First Army on 30 July 2007. He is responsible for assisting the Commanding General with the training, readiness and mobilization of all Army Reserve and National Guard units across the United States and two U.S. territories.

General Robinson graduated from North Carolina State University with Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees. He was commissioned through ROTC in 1973. He was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 67th Air Defense Artillery Regiment on the East/West German border and the 172d Ordnance Detachment in Kaiserslautern and Mannheim.

In 1977, General Robinson began his Army Reserve career with the 108th Division (Institutional Training) with assignments in Raleigh, Hickory, and Brevard, North Carolina. Beginning in 1980, he held various assignments with the 375th Transportation Group, Mobile, Alabama including Group S4 and Executive Officer. He served as the Executive Officer of the 845th Signal Battalion, Pascagoula, Mississippi and the 696th Maintenance Battalion, Mobile, Alabama and then commanded the 696th. He commanded the 375th Transportation Group from 1995-1998. Then he commanded the 3rd Brigade, 87th Division (Training) at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. He served as Deputy Chief of Staff (DCS) for Logistics, DCS for Operations, and Chief of Staff of the 81st Regional Support Command, Birmingham, Alabama. He served as Commanding General for the 3d Transportation Agency (Movement Control), from 2002-2003 for OPERATION ENDURING (OEF) and IRAQI FREEDOM (OIF). General Robinson was also the Commanding General for the 143d Transportation Command, Orlando, Florida and the 377th Theater Support Command (Forward) in OIF and OEF from 2006 to 2007.

General Robinson's military education includes the Air Defense Artillery Basic Course, the Infantry Advanced Course, the Command and General Staff College, and the Army War College. His awards include the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star (one oak leaf cluster), the Meritorious Service Medal (four oak leaf clusters), the Army Commendation Award (three oak leaf clusters), Parachutist Badge, and other decorations.
