Lieutenant Colonel Daniel Prieto is a native of Rome, Georgia.

He was a distinguished Military Graduate from The Citadel in Charleston, SC, for the class of 1994, and was commissioned thereafter as an active duty aviation officer. In 2005, he received a Juris Doctor degree from Loyola's College of Law.

Lt. Col. Prieto served in a variety of positions both in the active and reserve components. While active duty, he served as an OH-58D pilot, Platoon Leader, and Assistant S-3 in the 1-10th Attack Battalion, 10th Mountain Division. He served as a Platoon Leader and Executive Officer with Alpha Company, 6035th Aviation Support Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division, Bosnia-Herzegovina. With the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), he served as a Maintenance Test Pilot, Platoon Leader, and company Executive Officer.

With the Army Reserves, LTC served with USARC G-3/5/7 AV as a Plans Officer and later as a Training and Standardization officer in the USARC Aviation Directorate. He served as the Brigade S-1 for DET15, 244th Aviation Brigade (FWD), Joint Base Balad, Iraq. Most recently, he served as the Deputy G-3/7 for the 335th Signal Command (Theater).
