Command Sgt. Maj. Carlos G. Gonzalez Pabon entered the U. S. Army in June 1987 in the Puerto Rico Army National Guard. The Ponce, Puerto Rico native completed advanced individual training at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. In June 1989, he entered active duty service as a Field Artillery meteorological crewmember at Fort Sill, Okla.

Throughout his military career, Gonzalez has served in every leadership position, from team chief to Command Sergeant Major. His assignments include Headquarters and Headquarters Battery – Division Artillery (DIVARTY), 25th Infantry Division (Light), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; HHB DIVARTY, 101st Airborne Division, Fort Campbell, Ky.; HHB DIVARTY, 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Bliss, Texas; HHB Divarty, 2nd ID, Camp Stanley, Korea; 1st Battalion, 21st Field Artillery, Fort Hood, Texas; 5th Battalion, 82nd FA and 4th Brigade, 1st CD; and Battle Staff Noncommissioned Officer Course, Sergeants Major Academy, all at Fort Bliss; and Security Forces Assistance Team Sergeant Major for 1st Stryker Brigade Combat Team, 25th ID, Fort Wainwright, Alaska.
