CSM Ramon Fisher joined the 224<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, Iowa Army National Guard on 18 December, 1992. He conducted Basic Training with Bravo Company, 31<sup>st</sup> Engineer Battalion at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, during 1993. Following his High School graduation in 1994, he returned to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri to complete Advanced Individual Training with Foxtrot Company, 35<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion; and was awarded the MOS of 12B, Combat Engineer.

CSM Fisher transferred to Active Duty during March 1995 and was assigned to Bravo Company, 20<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas as a Squad Automatic Weapons Gunner. In 1998, he moved to Bravo Company, 326<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, where he was assigned as a Team Leader and later a Squad Leader. He deployed from August 1999 to January 2000, to Bosnia with Alpha Company, 502<sup>nd</sup> Infantry Regiment, 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division. He then returned to Bravo Company, 20<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, Fort Hood, Texas during 2001 to serve as a Squad Leader and an Augment Observer Controller at the National Training Center in Fort Irwin, California.

During December 2002, he was assigned as a Squad Leader in Charlie Company, 307<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion, 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division, Fort Bragg, North Carolina. That summer following the completion of the Sapper Leader Course, he was assigned as a Platoon Sergeant where he successfully led a platoon from August 2003 to April 2004 in Fallujah, Iraq with the 1/505<sup>th</sup> Parachute Infantry Regiment. Soon after returning from Iraq, his platoon executed a no-notice deployment to Afghanistan, from September 2004 to November 2004, with the 1/505<sup>th</sup> Parachute Infantry Regiment in support of the Afghan elections. He deployed to Samara, Iraq from August 2006 to April 2007 with Alpha Company, 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade Special Troops Battalion. CSM Fisher voluntarily extended his tour in Iraq an additional 11 months from May 2007 to March 2008, to serve as First Sergeant of Alpha Company, 2<sup>nd</sup> Brigade Special Troops Battalion in Baghdad, Iraq during the Operation Iraqi Surge. CSM Fisher later served as the Engineer Sergeant Major in CJTF-82 for Regional Command-East in Bagram, Afghanistan from May 2009 to June 2010. Then he served as the First Sergeant for the Engineer Basic Officers Course at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, prior to attending the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy from June 2011 to July 2012. During July of 2012, CSM Fisher returned to the 326<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion (AASLT) and subsequently transformed the unit into the 326<sup>th</sup> Brigade

Engineer Battalion, where he served as the 326<sup>th</sup> Brigade Engineer Battalion Command Sergeant Major for 30 months.

CSM Fisher is a graduate of the United States Army Sergeants Major Academy, Pre Command Course, Army Force Management School "Sergeant Major Course," Sapper Leader Course, Jumpmaster, Airborne and Air Assault School. He has a Bachelor of Professional Studies (BPS) Degree in Business and Management.

His military awards and decorations include the Sapper Tab, Senior Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Combat Action Badge, the Bronze Star (2 OLC), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (2 OLC), Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal (3 OLC), Joint Service Achievement Medal, Army Achievement Medal (3 OLC), NATO Medal (1 SS), Iraqi Campaign Medal (3 SS), Afghanistan Campaign Medal (2 SS), Valorous Unit Award and the Meritorious Unit Citation.
